Abel Prize. The Abel Prize is a Norwegian prize, named after Norwegian mathematician Niels Henrik Abel (1802-1829), and awarded annually by the King of Norway to one or more

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outstanding mathematicians. It is modelled as a replica of the Nobel prize and comes with a monetary award of 6 million Norwegian kroner (NOK) (€635,000 or \$740,000).

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
