As their fine motor skills develop, however, they will be able to handle a wider range of physical manipulations, such as holding a crayon between two fingers and a thumb (the way an adult would) while drawing circular shapes, crosses, and the early stages of more-intricate designs on large paper.

A child with a learning disorder in nonverbal skills appears to develop good basic language skills and strong rote memorization skills early in childhood. Difficulties are present in visual-spatial skills, visual-motor skills, and other skills necessary in social or academic functioning.

Swiss psychologist Jean Piaget came up with a famous theory about how children develop cognitive (or thinking) skills in stages. The first stage is when babies use their senses—sight, sound, touch, taste, and smell—to start to make connections.

### How Kids Develop Cognitive Skills - Understood

Child development is a process every child goes through. This process involves learning and mastering skills like sitting, walking, talking, skipping, and tying shoes. Children learn these skills, called developmental milestones, during predictable time periods. Children develop skills in five main areas of development: Cognitive Development

### How A Child Develops - Develop Skills

Motor competence in childhood is an important determinant of physical activity and physical fitness in later life. However, childhood competence levels in many countries are lower than desired. Due to the many different motor skill instruments in use, children's motor competence across countries is rarely compared.

### Cross-cultural comparison of motor competence in children ...

In children, a critical period for the acquisition of motor skills is preschool years (ages 3-5), as fundamental neuroanatomic structure shows significant development, elaboration, and myelination over the course of this period. Many factors contribute to the rate that children develop their motor skills.

Children are following commands that involve both gross and fine motor skills with greater ease. By age 6, children are more aware of their body and are less egocentric.
